Urinary Tract Infections -

No one wants to think about their dog getting a UTI, but it's important to know a little bit about them, as 14% of dogs will have one during their lifetime. Females are 2 to 4 times as likely to get a UTI than a male dog. A UTI occurs when there is colonization of microbial bacteria in any part of the urinary tract that is normally sterile. Your dog has many internal defenses that stop colonization of this kind from happening. When one of these defenses is affected and thrown off in some way, a dog may get a UTI. A UTI is also difficult to diagnose, as there can be times when a dog has a UTI and does not show any symptoms. Some common symptoms of a UTI are discolored or cloudy urine, a foul odor, or urination in inappropriate places. If you believe that your dog may have a UTI, you can take them to the vet and the vet will take a urine sample to diagnose the Infection. Some dogs have an episode of a UTI, and some have a chronic recurrence of the UTI. In both cases, specific antimicrobial drugs can be described for whatever type of infection the urine sample may reveal. Treatment of a UTI involves giving your dog the specified drug, usually for two weeks (although it can be longer depending on the severity of the infection and whether or not it is chronic), and monitoring the infection through cultures. No One knows your dog better than you do. If you notice some of these symptoms in your pup, it may be a UTI.
